



# SNAP & SNAP Supplements

## Will I get extra benefits?

**ALL households receiving SNAP benefits, including those receiving the maximum benefit will receive a 15% increase in SNAP benefits from January 1, 2021, through June 30, 2021.**

- The January benefit will be paid in the one-time schedule below.
- Beginning in February, the increase will be in your regular SNAP benefit.
- Federal Pandemic Unemployment Insurance will no longer be counted as income in applying for SNAP benefits.

**Will I get extra SNAP benefits? Yes, if you:**

- Receive SNAP
- Through June 30, 2021

For example:

- ✓ If you are a 3-person household and currently get \$200 per month, you will get \$416 to bring you up to the maximum benefit (\$616) for a household of 3.

**If you already get the maximum benefit for your household size, you will get a 15% increase.**

**When will I get the extra SNAP benefits?**

DHS will issue the January payment (EAs are usually issued in the second half of the month). For example, if your record number ends in 4, received your SNAP benefits on December 3.

**Do I need paperwork or an application to get the extra SNAP benefits?**

No. You don't need to fill out extra paper work. The extra SNAP benefits will be added to your EBT card and you'll be able to use it just like regular SNAP.

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 approved a 15% increase in SNAP benefits from January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021.
